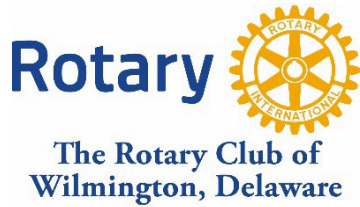

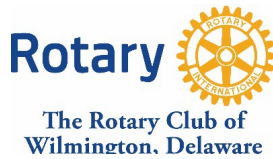

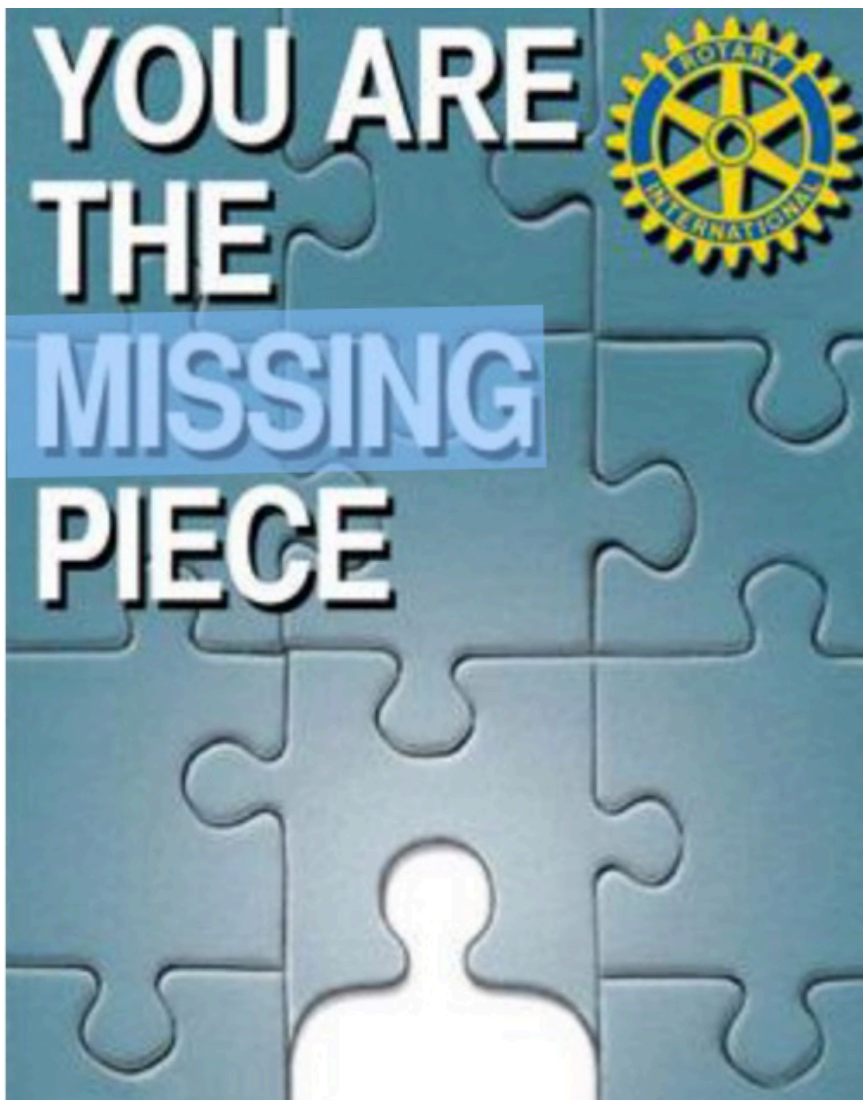
Ukraine is an agricultural powerhouse and a country of significant technological and strategic importance, but it has had a turbulent history. The buildup to the Russia-Ukraine war that began in February 2022 preoccupied many members of Rotary around the world, who worried about the future of Rotary within Europe's second-largest country.

Yet amid this turmoil, Rotary members in Ukraine continue to demonstrate resilience and an unwavering commitment to peace. As the war is raging throughout the country, Rotary clubs in Ukraine and around the globe are pitching in to help with Ukrainian refugees.

The first Rotary clubs within the current borders of Ukraine were chartered in the 1930s. During World War II, Rotary clubs disbanded in territories under conflict, and clubs were forcibly dissolved during the Cold War in countries under Communist rule.

After the collapse of the USSR, several clubs in Europe and North America sought to reestablish Rotary's presence in the former Soviet countries. Since Ukraine declared its independence in 1991, Rotary is undergoing robust growth on the strength of an influx of members who have joined since the beginning of that conflict. The national impulse to engage in humanitarian work and disaster assistance remains strong in Ukraine. Since 2014, Rotary has grown from 49 to 62 clubs, with an additional six satellite clubs. Membership has increased from 800 to 1,100 — and members of Rotary in Ukraine are very optimistic about the organization's continued growth.
